- 1) There has been a 35% increase in certificates and degrees awarded during the last five years. Increases have especially occurred in business and computing fields, career and technical education, and in nursing and other health professions.
- 2) Overall, six months after graduating, 95% (of those not continuing their studies) are employed and 81% are employed in their chosen field.
- 3) 97% of the students in career and technical fields (welding, diesel, instrumentation, millwright, and electrical systems) are employed and 82% are employed in their chosen field of study.
- 4) 100% of graduates in the health professions (nursing, radiology technology, medical coding and billing, and human services) are employed and 95% are working in their chosen field of study.
- 5) 75% of 2013 graduates with transfer degrees (AA, AS) continued their studies one year later, 55% were enrolled at GBC.
