Book Nook: Killing Lincoln

There are two reviews this month. The first book was Killing Lincoln by Bill O'Reilly and Martin Dugard. This was a very informative book. It goes into much detail about John Wilkes Booth's life before the shooting of the president and what happened to him afterwards as he tries to escape the authorities. This book reads like fiction but it's non-fiction. I learned a lot I didn't know about the civil war and all that President Lincoln did for America to keep it one nation. I have watched specials about the civil war on PBS, I have read books on the civil war, and have had to study the war in school. All that being said I still learned many interesting facts both about Booth and about the generals fighting the war. This book is so good you won't be able to put it down. The second book is called The Lost Wife by Alyson Richman. This was given to me as a quick read and it really was. You could read this in a couple of days and it will be well worth your time. The story starts out with Lenka, who lives in Prague in the 1930s during World War II, and about her love story with Josef. They are both Jewish so you can tell what happens here. The story is about how they get married and then are separated during the war. I am not giving anything away because in the beginning of the book she tells that they finally find each other when they are old. The story is told from each of their perspectives: Josef who escaped to America and Lenka who ends up in a Jewish camp run by the Nazis. This book is so well written that it will pull you in right away and knowing that this story is based on a true story makes it even more powerful. I highly recommend this book!
