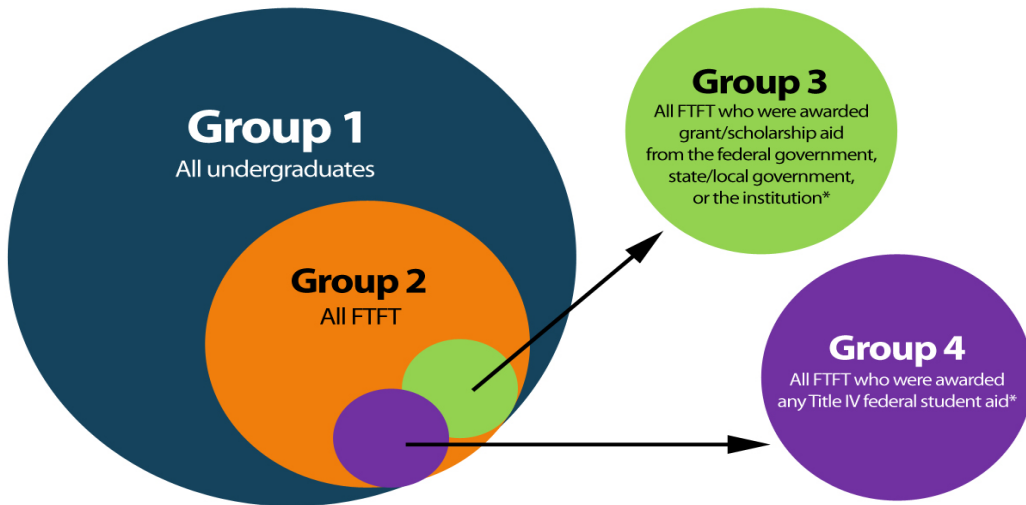

COA Revisions
