2025 FISCAL YEAR HIGHLIGHTS



Independent Audit

The Great Basin College Foundation engaged an independent accounting firm in an audit of its financial statements as of June 30, 2025. In the opinion of the auditor, the financial statements referred to present fairly, in all material respect, the financial position of Great Basin College Foundation.


The Great Basin College Foundation Board of Trustees reviewed and approved the management letter, and audited financials as presented at their meeting of September 18, 2025.

Highlights

- Total assets grew \$958,658 over FY24, which is an increase of 7.56%.
- Distributions to Great Basin College increased to \$1,180,187 an increase of \$149,125 from FY24.
- Investment income earnings totaled \$1,274,052.
- Additions to Foundation Endowments were \$12,600.
- Contributions revenue for FY25 ending are \$1,326,690, which is an increase of \$141,902 over FY24.

Great Basin College Foundation Golf Classic


The GBC Foundation held its second annual Great Basin College Foundation Golf Classic in early August 2024.




