This has been approved by the events committee, and we want to have this on each campus concurrently. Allocation of plants from the budget will be billed to each campus accordingly. She is requesting \$700 dollars for food and prize funding.

STUDENT ADVOCATE KENDALL MENTIONED THAT THERE IS NO PRESENTATION FOR THIS YEAR, AND NEXT YEAR MAY BE A CAMPUS CLEANUP. SENATOR COWAN MENTIONED THAT WE COULD PARTNER WITH PTK TO GIVE INFORMATION. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

B. SGA PINS WITH JESSICA ORTIZ

We would like to purchase SGA pins for everyone to have. She is requesting \$600 for food and prize funding.

SENATOR MITCHEL MOTIONS TO APPROVE. SENATOR SOSA SECONDS. SENATOR JACOBSON ASKED ABOUT THE FUNDING ACCOUNT. STUDENT ADVOCATE KENDALL MENTIONED THAT BECAUSE THEY ARE BEING GIVEN AWAY, IT'S THE CORRECT ACCOUNT FUNDING. SENATOR COWAN ECHOED WHAT STUDENT ADVOCATE KENDALL MENTIONED. HE HAS BROUGHT THIS UP BEFORE AND HE IS REALLY GLAD TO SEE THIS ITEM. SENATOR SOSA ASKED IF WE HAVE A DESIGN. STUDENT ADVOCATE KENDALL MENTIONED THE DESIGN IS MADE, AND IT'S OUR LOGO WITH COLOR. PRESIDENT RAINE MENTIONED THAT WE NEED TO GET ON TOP OF OUR SWAG. HE THINKS THEY WILL BE FANTASTIC. MOTION TO APPROVE PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

C. PAHRUMP BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT WITH SENATOR COWAN

by installing shade cloths and purchasing the necessary equipment and supplies. Our maintenance staff will complete the installation, which will significantly reduce costs.

This project will create an outdoor space for students to study, host events, and relax. With the ongoing improvements to our center, this space is both needed and beneficial for student engagement. He is requesting \$4000 for supply funding.

I am requesting \$3,000 from the Pahrump Valley SGA Funds Account to assemble gift bags for graduating students at the Pahrump Valley Center. I will work with Senator Coffill to put together these bags for students who will be walking at the Pahrump commencement on May 9. Proposed items include GBC alumni stickers, a T-shirt, a GBC pen, a Ram plushie, and candy. The estimated value is \$60 per bag of GBC swag. He is requesting \$3000 from food and prize funding.

SENATOR SOSA MOTIONS TO APPROVE. SENATOR JACOBSON SECONDS. SENATOR JACOBSON ASKED IF WE ARE GOOD TO DO THAT WITHOUT DOING ALL THE CAMPUSES. SENATOR COWAN STATED THIS IS COMING OUT OF PAHRUMP VALLEY BUDGET. THIS ISN'T AN EVENT, SO IT SHOULD BE OKAY, BUT HE WILL BE HAVING A CONVERSATION WITH THE PRESIDENT. SENATOR JACOBSON ASKED IF THIS WILL BE A TRADITION AFTER THIS YEAR OR JUST FOR THIS YEAR. SENATOR COWAN MENTIONED THEY ARE JUST TESTING THIS FOR THIS YEAR. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

E. LLC GRADUATION SUPPLIES WITH SENATOR COWAN

I am requesting \$500 in funding from the PVC SGA account to assist and collaborate with Winnemucca in providing cake, punch, and approved supplies for the LCC students' graduation. I started this tradition when I first became a Senator, and SGA has provided funding to help cover the cost of celebrating these students, and I would like to continue that tradition. SENATOR COWAN THANKED SENATOR MAYORGA AND MENTIONED HE WAS SOLELY FUNDING THIS WHOLE COST TO ALLOW THEM TO GET SOME OTHER THINGS DONE. SENATOR MAYORGA AGREED TO SPLIT THE COST. SENATOR SOSA MENTIONED WE COULD AMEND THIS TO SPLIT. SENATOR COWAN MENTIONED THAT HE WILL SEND AN EMAIL TO HIS ADMIN ASSISTANT

SO THEY CAN COORDINATE THE BUDGETS. SENATOR COWAN MOTIONS TO AMEND THE REQUEST \$250 FROM THE PAHRUMP VALLEY CENTER AND \$250 FROM WINNEMUCCA. SENATOR SOSA SECONDS. MOTION TO AMEND PASSES UNANIMOUSLY. MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

In accordance with Attorney General Opinion No. 00-047 (April 27, 2001), as restated in the Attorney General’s Open Meeting Law Manual, the President may prohibit comment if the content of that comment is a topic that is not relevant to, or within the authority of, the SGA, or if the content is willfully disruptive of the meeting by being irrelevant, repetitious, slanderous, offensive, inflammatory, irrational or amounting to personal attacks or interfering with the rights of other speakers.
